

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

On or about November 22, 2019, the City of Monticello intends to apply to the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs for a grant from the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program Wastewater Drinking Water Program. This program is funded by Title I of the federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. These funds are to be used for a community development project that will include the following activities: improvements to the water system throughout the designated improvement area, RCA Neighborhood. The total amount of CDBG funds to be requested is \$600,000. The amount of CDBG funds proposed to be used for activities that will benefit low- and moderate-income persons is \$390,000. The Applicant also proposes to expend an estimated \$262,550 in non-CDBG funds on the project. These non-CDBG funds will be derived from the following sources: Water Operating, Water Improvement, and Periodic Maintenance Fund.

City of Monticello will hold a public hearing on November 18, 2019 at 6:15 pm, in City Council Chambers, City Hall; 227 North Main Street, Monticello, IN 47960 to provide interested parties an opportunity to express their views on the proposed federally funded CDBG project. Every effort will be made to make reasonable accommodations for these persons.

Information related to this project will be available for review prior to the public hearing as of November 6, at the Mayor's Office, 227 North Main Street, Monticello, between the hours of 8am-4pm M-F. Interested citizens are invited to provide comments regarding these issues either at the public hearing or by prior written statement. Written comments should be submitted to Emily Gross at KIRPC PO BOX 127 Monon, IN 47959 no later than November 18, in order to ensure placement of such comments in the official record of the public hearing proceedings. A plan to minimize displacement and provide assistance to those displaced has been prepared by the City of Monticello and is also available to the public. This project will result in no displacement of any persons or businesses.
